How social services departments assess a person's health and social care needs under the community care legislation will be explained from a practical perspective; no prior knowledge will be assumed. The course will also consider the provision of Direct Payments and also what remedies may be available where someone is unhappy with the outcome of the assessment.

Course Aims

Attendees on the course will have opportunities during the course to try out ideas for themselves with the new skills and knowledge they will acquire during the day.

Communicating Through Touch Learning Disability Office, Cardiff 23 June 2010

Course Aims

This one day workshop will help those that care for someone with an Autism Spectrum Disorder use touch to help communication, relaxation and the relief of stress and anxiety.

The techniques you will learn during this workshop will help you and the person you care for engage and communicate together, relieve stress and feel more positive.

The techniques explored on this course centre on touch, communication and relaxation and will be useful tools that carers and parents can use in everyday situations.

Course Aims

To help you understand more about the issues affecting people with learning disabilities and how people and services can have a negative impact on their lives. The course will examine how services and society affect the lives of people with learning disabilities, and how to make this contribution a positive one.

Delegates will be encouraged to examine their own perceptions and actions as well as how their organisation works. Delegates will have an opportunity to look at some practical tools they can use to involve and understand the real needs of those that they work with.

Introduction to Benefits for disabled children and their families Learning Disability Office, Cardiff July 6

Course Aims

This course aims to give participants an overview of the entire benefit system and how it affects disabled children and their families

The course will address issues for young people in transition ie. when it is best for disabled children to come off their parents claim and claim in their own right and what benefits they could then claim.

These courses are at an introductory level so it is designed to raise awareness of benefits for these client groups but would not include any calculations etc.
